Policy Manual Process Reminder

SAG Guiding Principles

- Reminder: SAG is a forum that allows parties to express different opinions, better understand the opinions of others, and foster collaboration and consensus
- The following guiding principles from the SAG Process Guidance Document are intended to support collaborative discussion in SAG processes:
 - 1. Build trust and collaboration
 - 2. Educate and inform
 - 3. Offer constructive approaches and solutions
 - 4. Focus on the merits
 - 5. Ensure all interests are represented
 - 6. Participate in consensus discussions in good faith

Policy Manual Process

- Purpose of Policy Manual Subcommittee Version 3.0 Update Process:
 - To discuss proposed Illinois energy efficiency policies and reach agreement on Policy Manual Version 3.0
 - If there are proposed policies that may belong in the Illinois TRM Policy Document, it will also be updated

Proposed Policies:

- Participants had an opportunity in June to propose new policies for consideration in Policy Manual Version 3.0
- Proposed policies are posted on the <u>Policy Manual Subcommittee webpage</u>

Kick-off Meetings:

Two kick-off meetings were held (June and August) to briefly discuss all policy proposals at a high-level to better understand each proposal and identify initial questions or feedback

Policy Manual Process (cont.)

Dedicated Website:

All meeting materials are posted on the <u>Policy Manual Subcommittee webpage</u>

Monthly Meetings:

- Monthly meetings will include deeper discussion of proposed policies, and edits to draft policy language
- Presenters will be asked to provide the following:
 - Why the proposal is needed / background
 - Proposed policy language
 - Proposed effective date

Timeline:

- Goal is to reach conceptual agreement by end of April 2023
- Goal is to file Policy Manual with ICC for approval by end of June 2023

Follow-up from September Feedback Meeting

Why was feedback requested on policy proposals?

- During the June kick-off meeting, it was suggested by several participants that a threshold discussion is needed on what is appropriate to consider in the Policy Manual
 - * Policy Principles
 - Created by SAG Facilitator to help guide feedback
 - Presented at August meeting
 - Includes questions to consider when reviewing policies
 - Feedback was requested following the August kick-off meeting
 - Interested participants were asked to consider whether a policy proposal may not be necessary, or appropriate for the Policy Manual, or may belong in another forum outside of this Subcommittee
 - Feedback was due early Sept., summarized here: <u>Proposed Policy Tracker Feedback Received</u> on Policy Manual Proposals (9/15/2022)

Follow-up from September Meeting

- September 21, 2022 Policy Manual meeting focused on discussing feedback received on policy proposals
- Goal of the discussion was to determine next steps
 - 1. Participant may withdraw a policy proposal
 - 2. A policy proposal may be raised in another forum
 - 3. What if a participant feeling strongly about a proposal being discussed in the Policy Manual process, or if there is significant disagreement on whether a proposal should be considered?
 - The proposal will be presented to the Subcommittee once, with opportunity for discussion and feedback
 - The proposal will then be moved to a "non-consensus list", to be discussed at the end of the Policy Manual process
 - If disagreement remains at the end of this process, a comparison exhibit will be prepared to document various positions

Follow-up from September Meeting

- Policy Tracker was updated following the meeting participants agreed to remove several policy proposals from the consideration list
 - Proposed Policy Tracker (updated 10/18/22)
 - The policies that were removed are still posted on the <u>Policy Manual Subcommittee</u> <u>webpage</u>, in a separate section
- SAG Facilitator met with several stakeholders that received feedback on their policy proposals to discuss next steps
 - New Income Qualified Accountability Committee Section (Joint Stakeholders*)
 - Stakeholders to discuss high-level policy with IQ Committee Leadership Team before presentation to Policy Manual Subcommittee; purpose of this proposal is to memorialize the IQ Committee role
 - One-Stop Shop Program Design Definition for IQ Multifamily Retrofit (Joint Stakeholders*)
 - Stakeholders interested in principles for defining what is a "one-stop-shop" approach; stakeholders to propose updated policy language
