Meeting Notes

Action items are identified below in red.

Purpose of today's meeting: ComEd is interested in confirming stakeholder agreement to continue to:

- Use the project application date to determine the version of the IL-TRM the ComEd implementation team will follow. This is done in order to confirm the savings calculation <u>methodologies</u> as early as possible in our process due to the long planning horizon for the program.
- 2. Use the project permit date to determine the applicable version of the Illinois Energy Conservation Code (IL ECC).

Background on Affordable Housing New Construction Program + Policy Request (Connor Jansen, Slipstream and Jean Ascoli, ComEd)

- Affordable Housing New Construction is a ComEd, Nicor Gas, Peoples Gas and North Shore Gas joint program.
- There are 13 holistic measures requiring energy and indoor environmental quality improvements.
- Timeline for affordable housing projects = usually 1-3 years from the time of application date to completion of the project. As design progresses, it's usually linked to funding progressing to that project.
- To maintain a high level of predictable savings for the program, we see a need for the IL-TRM version to be linked to the application date.
- Incentives are quite high. If we aren't able to link the IL-TRM version to the application
 date, there are challenges that may arise due to changes in calculation methodologies in
 the IL-TRM (which can be difficult to estimate). Not linking the IL-TRM version to the
 application could provide uncertainty for customers on how much financial support they
 would get from the program.
- This program uses the permit date for the code baseline. This will not be impacted.
- There is a time limit within program rules if you apply, construction must start within a certain period of time.
- This program has used the IL-TRM in effect at the time of project application since Oct. 2017 (PY9 and PY2018). There is a new project evaluation team, so we thought it would be a good time to raise this with SAG.
- Phil Mosenthal: How does ComEd use the IL-TRM for the commercial new construction program?
 - Jean Ascoli: Commercial New Construction uses a whole building modeling approach, so there is no issue with the TRM (no prescriptive incentives).

Proposed Resolution for Review by SAG Participants

Background: SAG held a teleconference meeting on Tuesday, October 29, 2019 to discuss a policy question raised by ComEd regarding using the project application date to determine the version of the IL-TRM to follow for project applications submitted for the joint utility Affordable Housing New Construction Program. No concerns were raised by SAG participants during the October 29th meeting.

Proposed Resolution: For the joint utility Affordable Housing New Construction Program, Program Administrators (ComEd, Nicor Gas, Peoples Gas and North Shore Gas) will:

- 1. Use the project application date to determine the version of the IL-TRM the implementation teams will follow. The purpose of this is to confirm the savings calculation methodologies for projects as early as possible due to the long planning horizon for the program.
- 2. Use the project permit date to determine the applicable version of the Illinois Energy Conservation Code (IL ECC).
